

'Oh, do you?' said the man. 'Wait there.' He went inside, and then he came back to the window and poured a bucket of water all over Pinocchio.


'Here! Have a drink!' he said. 'Now go away or I'll throw the bucket at you too!'




Gepetto made Pinocchio some new feet and the little puppet hugged him.

buy my book, didn't you? I'll be a good boy.







'OK!' shouted the Puppet Master.





'Oh!' shouted the school bullies. 'A puppet!'






'You can't learn anything, Wooden Head!' said a boy.






